Science Diplomacy: As a tool for tackling cultural property illicit trafficking

May 25 and 26, 2023
9 to 11 h (Mexico City)
17 to 19 h (CET)

OBJECTIVES

To foster greater understanding about the links and possibilities of interaction between Science Diplomacy and scientific research, in relation to the illicit trafficking of cultural goods, by providing a variety of perspectives.

To diagnose the current situation regarding cultural heritage illicit trafficking and to identify gaps and scientific or political opportunities, while generating a space for dialogue that allows to elaborate on further efforts and challenges in order to address the illicit trafficking of cultural property in a comprehensive way at a national, regional and international level.

To promote a discussion that goes from the theoretical framework to the assessment of the feasibility of concrete actions, starting a series of exchanges with government actors, scientific, technical and academic experts, as well as civil society and private sector stakeholders.

FORMAT

The moderators will generate questions that encourage dialogue, analysis, discussion and proposals for lines of action, addressing the following topics:

- Archaeological looting.
- Trends and dimensions of the illicit trade.
- Related crimes.

- Authenticity, museums and auction houses.
- Inventory, provenance and new technologies.
- Laws and news.
- Cultural heritage management and sustainable development solutions.
- International, regional and local practices.
- Science Diplomacy and Cultural Diplomacy.

Key questions will include:

- What can scientific research tell us about the illicit trade in cultural goods?
- What is scientific data for, and for whom is it useful?
- How is the problem of illicit trafficking of cultural property integrated into foreign policy strategies?
- What role can Science Diplomacy play in supporting actions against the illicit trafficking of cultural goods?
- What are the already existing diplomatic actions?
- What is needed to develop greater international scientific cooperation on this issue?
- What mechanisms, practices or structures can Science Diplomacy provide to improve the prevention of the illicit trafficking of cultural goods?

These questions will be asked in a general way so that the participants can later express their opinion in a concrete way.
